
A STORY OF SURVIVAL & THE FIGHT FOR CHANGE

Anchored by the Holmes family, the series explores the strength of human connections, the consequences of moral ambiguity, and the unyielding pursuit of hope.


KEY THEMES

Grassroots efforts to curb violence and support affected communities will play a central role. These episodes will celebrate local heroes, activists, and organizations.

The overarching theme of hope will be tied to real stories of change—whether through activism, community support, or personal transformation.

Empowerment through Art

Art, in its various forms, will be showcased as a healing and empowering tool. This will connect directly to Gallery 3408's mission and The Education of Art initiative.



Character Overview

Jordan Holmes:

A 15-year-old artist whose sketches capture the complexity of his surroundings.

Rusty Barnes:

A morally ambiguous cop walking the line between justice and corruption.

Marcus Johnson:

A relentless district attorney determined to bring order to the chaos.

Grandma Mary Holmes:

The family matriarch, embodying strength and wisdom.


Grandpa Henry Holmes:

A community leader fighting to save the neighborhood's youth.
























Episode Guide

Episode 1: "The Beginning of Chaos"

The series opens with a carjacking epidemic in D.C., thrusting 15-year-old Jordan Holmes into the center of the chaos as he sketches his observations. A gang rivalry leads to the tragic death of Danielle's boyfriend, Derrick. Rusty navigates corruption while investigating a school stabbing and a kidnapped girl. The Holmes family gathers for Sunday dinner, finding solace in each other despite the turmoil.

Episode 2: "Lines Crossed"

Rusty's double life comes under scrutiny as his lieutenant assigns him to solve the alley murder of a fellow officer. Meanwhile, Danielle struggles with Derrick's funeral, and tensions rise as the community mourns another senseless act of violence. Jordan's art becomes a silent voice for the neighborhood, while Tyrone takes Jalen under his wing to steer him away from gang life.

Episode 3: "Ruptures and Resilience"

A daylight kidnapping attempt shakes the community, pushing Rusty deeper into the underworld for answers. Tyrone organizes a vigil to reclaim hope, while the Holmes family faces internal strife as Malik clashes with Andre. Jordan's sketches gain attention, becoming a subtle rallying cry for change.



Episode Guide

Episode 4: "The Return of Big C"

Recently released drug kingpin Calvin "Big C" Dawson asserts his dominance, throwing the city into disarray. Rusty must decide between protecting his interests and exposing a major drug ring. At home, Pops shares stories of past challenges, strengthening the family bond during another tense Sunday dinner.

Episode 5: "A Family Divided"

Malik and Andre's rivalry reaches a boiling point as the family's stability is tested. Tyrone plans a community outreach event to combat the growing gang influence. Rusty's secrets threaten to unravel as Marcus begins to suspect his involvement in the city's corruption.

Episode 6: "Hope in the Darkness" (Season Finale)

A major raid targets Big C's operation, and Rusty's role in the chaos comes to light. Jordan's sketches reveal hidden truths that inspire the community to take a stand. The Holmes family faces their biggest challenge yet but finds strength in their shared faith and love. The episode ends with a dramatic cliffhanger as Rusty's loyalties are tested.



Themes

Family and Community:

The Holmes family's resilience in the face of adversity serves as the series' emotional anchor.

Moral Ambiguity:

Work with a minimal crew and equipment, relying on handheld cameras and natural lighting.
